On April 20, 2009, OI received series response (See Exhibit #1). As of result of OI's recommendations, Engineering will bring formal charges against Mr. and assess appropriate discipline and has issued letter of instruction 09-02 to all engineering employees to review Amtrak's highway vehicle utilization and control policy.
On May 19, 2009, I received the signed voluntary waiver form for the case against charging Officer (See Exhibit #2). admitted his guilt in the case and accepted the discipline of a ten (10) calendar day suspension. Five (5) days suspension will be served immediately and five (5) days suspension will be held in abeyance for one (1) year from the date that he signed the waiver.

It is recommended that this case be closed pending the development of further information.
